I spent my industrial year working for United Biscuits at McVities - looking after Marks and Spencer Christmas Cake Production and biscuit manufacture. After graduation I worked for Harvey Nichols as Bakery and Patisserie buyer and decorated cakes in my spare time. I decided to leave Harvey Nichols and set up my own cake company - Little Venice Cake Company. Within a year I was asked to design and create Madonna's wedding cake. Jump forward 14 years and my clients have included David Beckham, Pierce Brosnan, Paul McCartney, Gordon Ramsay and Her Majesty the Queen. I have written 5 international award winning books and am a judge on ITV's Britain's Best Bakery. In 2010 I was honoured with an MBE for my outstanding contribution to the catering industry. I feel the grounding I received at Kennicott certainly laid the foundations to my success. I am grateful to my 3 key inspirational teachers - Louise Sessions, Dave Waistnidge and Katrina Borowski.

Finn Hanlon, a former KEVICC student, has succeeded in fulfilling the dream that all too many aspiring young actors find impossible. Finn, now 29, has just been on stage in the Theatre Royal, Plymouth in *War Horse*, the hugely successful stage adaptation of Michael Morpurgo's novel. The play is currently on a national tour and Finn is signed up for a ten month contract with the show. Previously, Finn toured Devon author Michael Morpurgo's *Private Peaceful* as a low-key, one-man play in 2009. In *War Horse* he plays cavalry officer Captain Nicholls, who leads Joey, a Devon farm horse, into battle in the spectacular production. 'This is the show of the decade,' he says, with a mixture of pride and wonder. *And to get the chance to come back to Plymouth and spend some time down here and stay at home – it couldn't get any better.* Finn has also toured with Edward Hall's acclaimed all-male Shakespeare company Propellor, most recently in *The Taming of the Shrew* and *Twelfth Night*. Finn began in school productions at KEVICC and with the Playgoers at Dartington Hall. He gained a degree in drama at the Royal Welsh College of Music and Drama in Cardiff and went on to find steady work in theatre. ... a very difficult thing to achieve.
