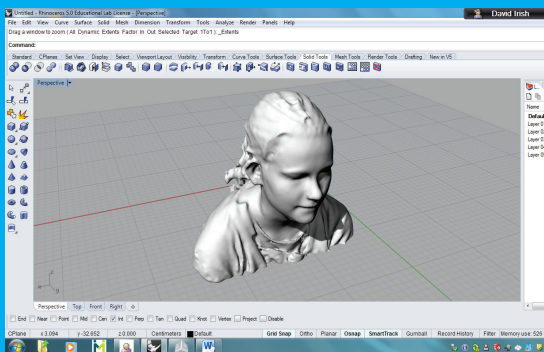


Activities Week Summer 2016

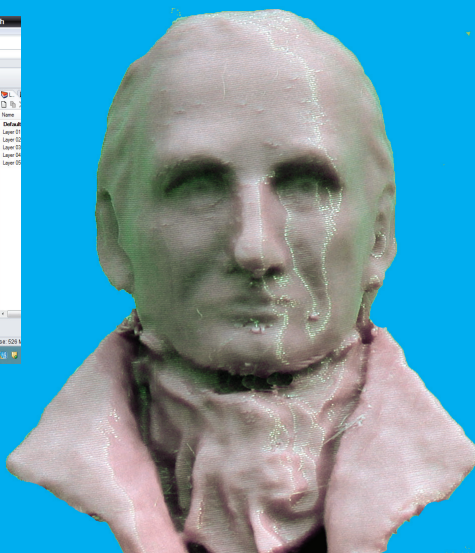
Students were given a choice of thirty different activities to choose from, both in the College and off-site. These ranged from Plymouth Argyle football coaching and aero-modelling to mural painting, strategy games and song writing.



One activity was based in our high-tec Design & Technology studios, where students were able to use the 3D scanners and printers. They could scan each other's heads, and also our statue of Charles Babbage (one-time King Edward V1 Grammar School pupil). The computer-aided design CAD program prototyped the scans onto the sophisticated 3D printers, which then printed them out using PLA biodegradable filament.



This was their first try with scanning Babbage – we hope to go on and make a really accurate replica to keep in the College.
