Arts Lab at Dartington

Arts Lab is a heady mix of energy, young people and collaboration, and has been set up by artist Sara Downham Lotto in an inspirational studio space in the grounds of Dartington.

Twenty-six Year 8 KEVICC students spent a recent Curriculum Enrichment day in the 'Lab' with Sara, supported by film and media tutor Martin Walker; videographer and film producer James Rowden; recent film and photography KEVICC graduate Zanna Lotto and the KEVICC Ariel Gallery Co-ordinator, Lucinda Wheater.

Each young person had the day to explore and experiment with film and painting and was given the freedom to express themselves in both disciplines with guidance from professionals.

KEVICC students and staff raised over £700 for Children in Need last month, mostly through payments for mufiti dress, but also with events such as busking at lunchtime to entertain the lunch queue. Staff joined with Sixth Formers to perform on a variety of instruments and with a singer. All students have a chance to take part in this busking slot, which is enjoyed by all.
