What is the essential knowledge from this unit? What do students need to remember and understand? Summary: The aim of this topic is to start preparing students for their KS4 music option which they will start the next academic year. The music B-Tec course requires students to be able to effectively research different genres of music to assist them with their practical work. Many other GCSE subjects also require you to be able to research effectively to again assist with coursework and written exams. The battle of the band's topic is a 6-week project where each week students explore a different band from pop music from the 1960s onwards for example The Beatles, Queen and Muse and how these bands have impacted on modern, popular music. Student undertake a piece or research and/or documentary on the band that is being studied that lesson and then create an informative information sheet/video on what they have learnt about that band. Students are also encouraged throughout this project to research how each band used elements of music differently and how the change in elements help support the genre.
