## What is the essential knowledge from this unit? What do students need to remember and understand?

This topic explores the concept of RELIGION using Ninian Smart's 7 Dimensions of Religion. Students will start by reflecting on their own ideas about religion and what distinguishes a simple belief from a religion. They will then look in turn at each of the 7 Dimensions, as identified by Smart, exploring them through some of the world's main religions.

The main intention is to uncover student misconceptions about, and broaden their understanding of religion, religious belief and the role that religion plays in people's lives.

By the end of the topic students will know the different dimensions as identified by Smart and be able to give examples of these in action:

- Ritual
- Material
- Experiential
- Mythical
- Philosophical
- Ethical
- Social

They will also be beginning to grasp that religion itself is more than just having faith in God, starting to see how it shapes the life of a believer.

Students will develop their knowledge through: analysing religious ideas and concepts; comparing and contrasting different religions; considering how faith is put into action; evaluating the importance of different aspects of religious practice in the life of the believer; reflecting on their own and others' personal responses, beliefs and ideas
