1. Staff Absences

2. Summer Exams 2022

Please read it carefully as there are details specific to your young person that need checking, as well of course as lots of information about the coming exam season. Y11 parents have also be emailed today a revision guide of extra sessions happening over the coming weeks.

3. Staffing Changes

It has been a busy term recruiting and appointing new staff to help us continue to take KEVICC forward. I'm delighted that we will be welcoming (back) Dan Gillard to us as Assistant Principal. Dan will be initially splitting his time between us and Kingsbridge before working up to full-time at KEVICC.















In July, we will be welcoming our new Director of Science, and in September he will be joined in the Science team, by two new teachers. In September, we will also be welcoming two new Maths teachers as well as a new MFL teacher.
