Parent and Carer Update: Industrial Action Wednesday 15 and Thursday 16 March 2023

I hope this finds you well. I am sorry to have to continue to write to you regarding industrial action. It is very disappointing proposed negotiations to resolve the dispute have yet to happen. Unfortunately, it seems unlikely that they will do so. Therefore, we are anticipating that the planned industrial action next Wednesday and Thursday will go ahead.

This again means that school will only be open to the following year groups next Wednesday 15 and Thursday 16 March:

Year 7

Year 11

Year 13

We are making separate arrangements for a small group of Y10 students who are preparing for their upcoming GCSE dance exam to attend the school on Thursday morning. Sarah McInally will be in contact with the parents and carers of these students.

Again, we are very aware of the disruption this may cause parents and carers, however given the likely disruption we are to face, we feel this is the most appropriate decision, although it is a difficult one to take.

As ever, we are prioritising based on age and their upcoming exams.

If possible, we will offer places to both our vulnerable students and those students with critical worker parents or carers in Year 8, 9, 10 and 12.
